SUNDAY REFLECTION

It's Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday, and most if today's readings shimmer and pulsate with joy. It's the Gospel that, at first blush, seems anti-climactic, as an ascetic John the Baptist preaches sacrifice to those wishing to receive his baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And yet there are three causes of rejoicing here that can also transform our lives.

The first is the stirring of desire for a holy life from such unlikely characters as tax collectors, soldiers and well, ordinary people. The second is their humble, courageous and fearsome question: "What should we do?" They so longed for the forgiveness of their sins that wealth, power and position faded away before the promise of a clean heart. And John's response – his good news – was within their reach: act fairly and honestly. But the greatest cause for rejoicing is the glimpse John gave of the Saviour coming to baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire: a baptism of holiness beyond their comprehension and beyond his own grace.

As we approach the Advent of our Lord into the very marrow of our humanity, washing away our sins and promising a baptism into his divinity, let us muster the hope and the audacity to ask, "What must I do, to open my heart to this grace today?" *Excerpt from Living with Christ.*

"SIMBANG GABI" AT ST. JOSEPH...

This Christmas tradition is coming to St. Joseph Parish once again, and will be celebrated starting **Sunday**, **December 15th** during the 12:00pm mass up to **Monday**, **December 23rd**. Other masses designated for this novena are; **Monday**, **December 16th** at 7:00pm, **Tuesday December 17th** at 7:00pm, **Thursday December 19th** at 7pm, **Saturday**, **December 21st** at 5:00pm, **Sunday December** 12noon and **Monday**, **December 23rd** at 7:00 pm. The traditional Christmas custom of "**Simbang Gabi**" in the Philippines, is a devotional 9-day novena (series of masses), practiced by Roman Catholics in anticipation and preparation for the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to honour our Blessed Mother. "Simbang Gabi" is not just an old custom that is celebrated because we want to, but rather it is a way of asking "favor or blessings" from the Lord, as it is believed that if one completes the whole series of nine masses, prayers and/or intentions will be granted. There will be breaking of bread and fellowship at the church hall following each **Simbang Gabi** masses. Everyone is welcome to join this 9-day mass novena/celebration at St. Joseph's to experience an old but popular Filipino tradition. Hope you can join us.
